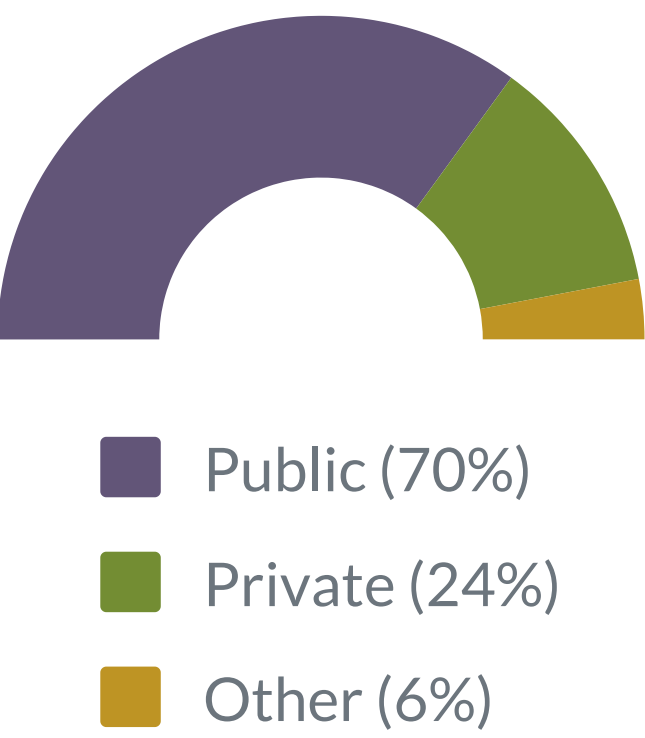

ON CAMPUS RESOURCES

Student Inclusion & Belonging - engages students to ensure that the core Trinity University value of Intentional Inclusion is visible and celebrated in the academic, professional, and social development of each student, regardless of background.

Gender Neutral Housing - allows students to select a roommate and suitemates based upon compatibility, without constraints of only having access to select roommates of the same assigned sex. Trinity University rejects the use of assigned sex or gender as the default method of assigning housing.

Tiger Learning Center - is a centralized hub for academic coaching, writing and quantitative reasoning tutoring, and student accessibility services.

TigerCare Live - provides free, on-demand remote telehealth, with 24/7 urgent medical care, mental health counseling, mental health crisis counseling, and psychiatry.

Center for Experiential Learning and Career Success - serves as a one-stop shop to help prepare and empower Tigers for life after Trinity—from their first day on campus to the first day of their career.
